The meeting was called to order at 7:07 PM. The Invocation was given by Councilmember Wendelken and the Pledge to the Flag was recited.

Approval of the agenda with the following additions: Item #14A, Approval of an agreement with Peachtree Laser for the 2016 Freedom Rings in Rincon Festival; and 14B, Approval of Change Order #1 for Ricketson Construction in the amount of \$10,900.00.

New Business:

1. Payton Moxley would like to appear before Council to discuss ongoing concerns about Lost Plantation.

Mr. Moxley presented a slide show presentation. He told Council that the golf course gets very little play and if the golf course closes the City will lose. The presentation included slides on the economic impact, the greens, curb appeal, and a Lost Plantation Golf Course Committee. He thinks the community needs to understand the City's current and future plans for the golf course and the course needs to advertised. Mayor Lee addressed the issues. Mr. Moxley asked Council their thoughts on starting a committee, Mayor Lee said these have been talks about a committee in the past but other problems have come up.

Seth Zeigler presented Council with pictures that he has taken of the greens. Councilmember Dasher asked Mr. Zeigler his thoughts on a committee. Councilmember Daniel told the residents present that Council does know about the problems and are addressing them. Mayor Lee said so much depends on the weather, temperature and sunshine.

Diane Lindquist, 114 St Andrews Way, stated if she put her house on the market a golfer would not buy it, why our greens can't look like the ones in Savannah. Councilmember Scott stated the greens are based on the dirt, elevation and sunshine, we want it to be one of the best. Al Hicks, 511 Lakeview Drive, asked Mr. Zeigler do they aerify the greens. Lynn Childress, 4 Dresler Drive informed Mr. Zeigler he can have access to his equipment if he needs it, he said he did go out and looked at the problem greens, the southern sun will not get over the top of the trees. When the grass is in shade it will not grow, Seth needs help and monetary support. Michelle Weckstien 525 Dresler Road said the clubhouse does not look good, and they could make money if we had good food service and beer was sold to golfers. Mayor Lee stated hopefully we can have a good golf course and not spend a lot of money.

Councilmember Browher directed staff to get with Mr. Moxley and see about a time to meet at the golf course for a workshop.

2. Amend 2016 Budget to include expenditures for UV Disinfection Light Bank for the WWTP.

Wanda Simmons told Council at the last meeting the payment was approved and this budget amendment is to bring it forward to keep the budget in line.

Councilmember Daniel said she thinks a budget amendment needs to be done for the 2015 invoices to bring the funds forward for the 2016 year. Mrs. Simmons said she checked with Attorney Dickey and we can do a budget amendment on the next agenda. She also verified the amounts of all the invoices. Councilmember Daniel stated she doesn't mind paying the 2016 bill but would like to hold off on the 2015 bills until the budget amendment is done.

4. Amend Policy 045 (Administrative and General Office Procedures) of the Rincon Personnel Policy Section 45.17 Dress Code, paragraph A.

Mrs. Simmons informed Council that Betzy Rodriguez has been going through he personnel manual and this issue has come up. Councilmember Daniel made some suggestions about leather coats and types of shoes. Mayor Lee said one of the things he has seen with dress code policies pertaining to shoes, is covered toes and not wearing slip on shoes with no back. LaMeisha Kelly said she wears open toes and would ask that Council leaves it in the policy.

Mr. Metzger told Council R.B. Baker has completed the curb and gutter and sidewalks. Councilmember Dasher asked about the time line, Mr. Metzger said they are on schedule. Mrs. Kelly said the light will be up on June 9th and it will flash for three days.

Chief Rahn told Council this was for an extended cab, not a regular cab. The vehicle will be assigned to Captain Reed and it will be replacing the Crown Vic.

13. Request to approve Task Order with Integrated Science and Engineering to conduct 2016 Water Quality Monitoring for Watershed Protection Plan for the lump sum fee not to exceed \$16,800.00. Line item # 50.7280.2202.

Mrs. Kelly reminded Council that we need to start testing for 2016.

Chris Tollison with Integrated Science and Engineering informed Council the long term monitoring needs to be done at four sites in the city. The 2015 results did not render any obvious problems; they were normal results for the area. They prepared an annual water quality report and they will submit a copy to EPD. Two copies with be left with the City, one in Mrs. Kelly's office and one at the WWTP. Mrs. Kelly stated she understood you can't bind future Council to contract, but some way we need to do multi testing with this company. Integrated Science and Engineering recalculated their fee and will do the work for the same fee as 2015. Mrs. Kelly asked Council if we can work with them this year to get the testing done.

Mr. Metzger informed Council they have been working with contractors and property owners to get ground water out of the yards that were affected. They are installing a perforated pipe to help with drainage. Net amount after decreases will be \$3,245.00.

15. Administrative Reports:

City Manager – No written report. Mrs. Simmons informed Council that she has received an invitation for the annual Effingham Chamber meeting June 9th from 7:00 PM -9:00 PM; Ms. Johnnie Lyons has started part-time at the WWTP; and she has done research on the cost of used vans, she found a 2000 used Chevy 14 passenger van for \$7,000.00. Councilmember Browher asked why the van had so little miles when it is 16 years old; Mrs. Simmons said it was a church van. Councilmember Browher would like to see staff pursue this option. Councilmember Scott mentioned the playground equipment and would like to see it on the next agenda.

City Engineer – No written report.

Chief of Police – No written report. Chief Scholl said they are near the end of the Citizens Police Academy; it will end the first week of June.

Fire Department - No written report.

Building/Zoning Dept. – LaMeisha Kelly submitted a written report to Council. She mentioned she should be receiving invitation to the grand opening for Kroger; the Kroger project meetings are every Wednesday. Councilmember Dasher asked about the timbered property in front of Williamsburg. Mrs. Kelly informed him they will pick up the large trees when they do the clearing.

Water/Sewer/Public Works – No written report. Mr. Bowles told Council he will be in Jekyll Island next week on a conference.

Lost Plantation – No written report. Mr. Zeigler told Council he has purchased range balls (2000) and they are being taken by golfers, so he went with baskets instead of mess bags and he has been in contact with a company that does ball retrieval in ponds. Mayor Lee stated some of the bad balls are probably coming from golfers that pick up balls on the greens and bring them to the range. Mr. Zeigler said the company he is looking at now will keep them in constant supply of balls.

Mayor and Council – Councilmember Scott asked about the drainage issue on 7th Street, Mrs. Kelly said the gentleman should be out there any day to survey. Councilmember Ricker asked if the work crew could look at the ditches on Lexington Avenue.
